Use blue or whatever jewel colors you wish to light candles, so you may center your vision on praying for the coming light of the Jesus child. His Spirit offers these gifts and Christian disciplines of hope, peace, joy, and love that ground us in our Baptism to live as followers of Christ.

<u> Biblical Verse & Prayer for Lighting 1st candle - HOPE:</u>

Book of Romans 15:13 May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. "Holy and Triune God, we ask for your presence to fill our hearts and homes. May the hope of the coming Lord call us to bear this gracious light to everyone. In Jesus' name, we pray. Amen."

Hymn Verse & Prayer for Lighting 2nd candle - PEACE:

ELW #256 Comfort, Comfort, Now My People. God will reign in peace forever. "Reigning God, surround conflict and war with your promised peace in our world. Help us live as peacemakers in our relationships and communities. In Jesus' name, we pray. Amen."

Hymn Verse & Prayer for Lighting 3rd candle - JOY:

ELW #253 He Came Down. Jesus came down that we may have joy! "Gracious God, may the joy of your salvation fill us with gladness. Lead us to invite all to discover this joy as we respond to any in need. In Jesus' name, we pray. Amen."

<u>Gospel Verse & Prayer for Lighting 4th candle - LOVE:</u>

Gospel of Matthew 22:37-39 Jesus said, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all our heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself.' "Holy God, may all know us by your love, inspiring us to love one anotoher as you have loved us. 

GALILEE'S 65TH ANNIVERSARY - REMINISCING.....


Steve & Karen Groebner


