ELCA The Rev. Yehiel Curry has been elected to a six-year term as presiding bishop of the ELCA. The election took place July 30 during the ELCA Churchwide Assembly in Phoenix, Arizona. Curry, who was elected on the fifth ballot, will be the ELCA's first Black male presiding bishop. As a member of Shekinah Chapel, in Riverdale, Ill, Presiding Bishop-Elect Curry began as their lay mission developer while he participated in the Theological Education for Emerging Ministries (TEEM) program, which prepares individuals for ordained ministry in



the ELCA focusing on emerging ministry contexts like ethnic-specific, multicultural, rural and innercity settings. Previously, Curry had served as bishop of the ELCA Metropolitan Chicago Synod since 2019. He also previously served as pastor (2012-2019) of Shekinah. He received a Bachelor of Arts from Lewis University in Romeoville, Ill, in 1995 and a Master of Divinity from the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago (LSTC) in 2013. The Bishop-Elect will be installed on Saturday, Oct. 4, at Central Lutheran Church in Minneapolis. The presiding bishop installation is open to the public, and tickets are not required. Doors open at 1 p.m. Central time, and worship begins at 2 p.m.



ELCA Secretary: The Rev. Lucille "CeCee" Mills was elected to serve a six-year term as secretary of the ELCA. Pastor Mills noted that she is also a product of the TEEM program. The Office of the Secretary provides administrative services and tools for ELCA leaders who are serving in congregations, synods and the churchwide organization, especially those given responsibility for governance. The secretary interprets the

constitutions and other governing documents and is responsible for maintaining its rosters, the ELCA archives, and the minutes and records of certain meetings. The Office of the Secretary receives the annual report of the congregations, provides travel and physical arrangements for meetings of the churchwide organization, compiles information for the online ELCA Directory, staff the nominating processes of this church and coordinates the use of legal counsel.

New St. Paul Area Synod Treasurer: Matt Smith was appointed to a four-year term as treasurer of the synod, beginning August 1st. Matt is a member of Christ Lutheran in Marine on St. Croix and has been involved with Bega Kwa Bega programs. Over his career, he has served with USDA as Commissioner of the Minnesota Department of Revenue, as finance director for the City of St. Paul, and most recently as finance director and county manager for Dakota County until his retirement last year. Matt lives with his wife on a family farm near the St. Croix River. We welcome him to this

new service as an officer of the synod! Laden, who has served as synod sented financial reports at synod with church financial folks at many and has been a well-spoken advocate continue to serve on the synod's


YOUNG AT HEART - Sharell

OUR HARVEST SEASON - Interim Pastor Kelly

We describe the season with our limited meteorological knowledge as Fall. The greening will diminish and eventually die. In North America, the seasonal change is received with cooler weather and shadowy mornings. Nothing wrong with calling the season Fall, but it remains, liturgically for Christians, the harvest season of Pentecost. One of the plans for October is to focus on the theme of creation during worship. At Galilee, we will be giving thanks for the created mission and ministry that started 65 years ago, May 1960. In addition, the Galilee Council is prayerfully requesting your 2026 financial commitment as a stewardship pledge.

For three weeks in September during fellowship (no adult faith forum), members and guests will be discussing the practices that brought Galilee to these 65 years. These weeks will focus on constitutional purposes of the ministry and mission that Galilee continues to steward; by caring, loving, sharing, and welcoming your financial commitment in pledging for 2026, Galilee's 66th year!
