Blessed Easter to you and yours!

The Easter season is a reason for boasting! We get to boast individually and corporately in how your baptized personal and public witness, as a member of Galilee, opens for you the love of Jesus at work in your life as well as the life of Galilee Lutheran's mission and ministry! Holy Week at Galilee had three scheduled worship offerings, only one additional, primarily for seniors, at 11:30 am on Wednesday with prayers of healing and Holy Communion. Given that the call to ordain leadership at Galilee is 80% time (measured as 32-34 hours/week) it is easy to exceed - - - with and without attentive planning.

On the Resurrection of Our Lord, Easter Sunday morning, I overextended myself after purchasing mylar balloons stating "Happy Easter" and obtaining bamboo sticks to make Easter signs for greeting Galilee worshipers and our neighbors. I did not know whether there was any energy in my well for completing this task but when I arrived in Galilee, a little after 7:00am, a member who had arrived earlier greeted me with "Happy Easter" and asked how to help. By 8:00am, with helping hands, eight Easter signs were created and placed along Rice and McCarrons. Also placed were two attached signs saying "Enter Here" at both parking lot entrances. It is a boastful greeting for all! On Easter Monday, a member removed the rain-soaked damaged signs. Any suggestions for signs to welcome first-time worshipers to Galilee?

The week before the Passion of our Lord/Holy week, I attended two community meetings. On April 10, *Do Good Roseville*, an all volunteer organization, hosted a discussion on immigrants and refugees for the Roseville Area Faith Community. A summary is being emailed to all Galilee members, and will also be available on the narthex table. Please pray for and engage in your communities and at Galilee.

The second community meeting I attended was for Northeast Family and Youth services. It is a community mental health clinic with offices in Shoreview and White Bear Lake. They offer services like youth diversion to help families not experienced in the juvenile detention system.

AROUND OUR CHURCH

"GRIEF IN THE CHURCH SYSTEM" (SUMMARY BY MIRIAM PETERSON)

(by Rev. Dr. Jules Erickson; Feb. 22, 2025)

It's hard to say goodbye to a pastor. There's anxiety in the departure and also in the wait for a new pastor. We have to go through stages of grief from anger to denial to acceptance. Grief is about the process. Pastor Erickson thinks it is more important to tell our stories than just to state statistics.

Losing people in the congregation - pastor or members - puts us "out of whack". If there is pain in the congregation, it affects all of us. It is important to talk about the pain rather than hide it away in a dark place. The Call Committee needs to talk about the history of the church to each other and to the new pastor. Be willing to discuss the dark times as well as the good times. It's important for the "OWLS" (Older Wiser Seniors) to remember and speak up. (This is like Gloria Johnson telling us her story.) Anxiety is the most addictive emotion. We need to soothe ourselves by having compassion for ourselves and each other. In the U.S. right now we are all experiencing hard times. Pastor Erickson says that rather than building walls, we should build a longer table to invite others in. According to MPR, many pastors are under great stress. How do you preach to the red and the blue? Try to remember that long table of inclusion, rather than creating high walls.

Is our church dying? We need to talk about that worry. Churches like Galilee need permission to change. You can't continue everything from the past. It is good to adjust and be able to drop some old things and add in new. For example, at a Galilee without children we had to drop GLOW and now maybe GLOWOUT as well, with the filled backpacks. We are hoping to get school supplies for Edgerton School without having the big party at church. We can do more for the seniors we do have. Pastor Erickson had some books to suggest. If you want to know more, a list of titles can be made available. Most important, be willing to talk to each other. Share your concerns and your hopes. Please talk to the Call Committee members as well.
