Dear People of Galilee,

Thursday, September 10, in the afternoon, Carlos Ramos came to meet me in Galilee's church library. He had heard that Galilee is a welcoming, safe place. We visited, with masks on, staying far apart from each other. Our conversation that Thursday was so interesting! Carlos gave trilingual explanations of culture, spirituality, and history, full of hope.

During three months of occasional encounters, totally masked, amidst this pandemic, I had formed a visual, mental image of what Carlos looks like. I am laughing with delight because upon receiving this awesome photograph, I see now that Carlos and his fellow dancers look completely different than I had expected without masks on. I am so amused by this, and all the other surprises that 10 months of social distancing is having on my perception of our community. Maybe our relationship with our Lord God is kind of like that. We think we are seen by our Lord in a certain way, but actually God sees so much more. God knows us from the inside out, and sees us with much more complexity, detail and magnificence.

I requested this straightforward description of Carlos's group: "*Kalpulli Tlaloctecuhtli* means the great Lord of rain, lightning, and thunder. Our group is composed of youth that are committed to lifelong learning of the philosophy, dance, drum, and songs of the Mexica/Nahua/Aztec traditions."

As a church, the ELCA, we are committed to inter-religious relations, dialogue and common action for the sake of the world God loves so much. I thank God for Carlos coming to Galilee, to enrich us with inter-religious knowledge and friendship.

In closing, I want to share these words from our Church, the ELCA, about the importance of such interdependence. "God's vision is of a world in which humans and creation, in all their glorious diversity, live in unity, justice and peace. In such a

2. On **YouTube**. Pastor Dana will send the direct link to the YouTube video on Saturday or Sunday, so if you would like to be on that email list to receive the YouTube link, let her know. Here again, the video will be available long after Sunday morning.
3. For those who have internet, the best way to feel part of the Galilee worship will be to connect on this **Zoom** link: [Click Here](#). This link should work for all Sunday Galilee worships for the 9:30 am service all through the winter. While the official service will begin at 9:30 Sunday, the meeting will

- open 20 minutes earlier and will stay open 20 minutes after the service, so that we can all see our friends and say a few words to one another. New people are welcome too! If you haven't previously used Zoom, clicking the above link will first ask you to join the free service.
4. **For those with no internet** connection, we will allow a limited number of people to come to watch the service video on the large screen in the Galilee sanctuary on Sunday morning at 9:30 a.m. People will be well separated and will be expected to wear masks. The number will be limited to only ten. Understand that this will not be a "live" service. It will be a viewing of the zoom gathering and service on the screen. GALILEE'S FINANCIAL UPDATE by Miriam Peterson

Our offerings were behind by about \$2,000 in November. We are doing well the first two weeks in December with offerings of over \$9,500. We need about \$12,500 per month to meet the budget. We will be OK through this year because we received a \$22,000 forgivable loan from the government. We have now received 33 pledges for 2021 for a total of almost \$104,000. This is just \$2,000 behind the pledges for 2020. Thank you! Your 2020 tax statements will be sent out in January. If you have any questions, please contact Miriam Peterson.

PAYROLL PROTECTION PROGRAM UPDATE

As part of the legislation provided by the federal government to help alleviate the financial impact of COVID-19 a law was passed that included a program called the Payroll Protection Program (PPP).

This program allowed qualified organizations to apply for a low interest loan to be used for qualified expenses such as payroll, utilities, and mortgage interest. The law also allowed for forgiveness of these loans up to the amount of the loan used to cover qualified expenses in the six months after the loan was received.

Galilee applied for a PPP loan of \$22,000 and after being approved the funds were received in May. In November, we submitted an application requesting forgiveness of the entire loan and provided documentation substantiating the use of the funds for payroll, and other qualified expenses. On December 15th we received notice from the bank that our forgiveness application had been approved for the entire amount of the loan.

This loan was instrumental in allowing Galilee to continue to pay the entire staff during 2019 and free up our other funds to cover other ongoing expenses.

Along with the generous contributions of all our members these PPP funds helped put us on a stable financial position going into 2021.

Annual Meeting - January 31, 2021

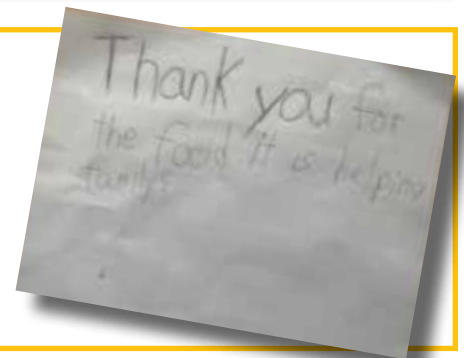
