
Galilee Members and Friends

Permit me to explain the curious outfit I put on before celebrating the Sacrament of Holy Communion. This liturgical vestment is a chasuble. During my second congregational call at St. Paul's in Carlisle, PA., a member gifted me chasubles in every seasonal liturgical color. The Galilee Lutheran paraments (the cloths draping the lectern and altar) are in all the seasonal liturgical colors



as well: (Advent-blue; Christmas-white Epiphany-green; Lent-purple; Palm Sunday-scarlet; Easter-white and/or gold; Pentecost-red then green (the longest season of the church calendar year)). These liturgical colors match the chasubles that I wear and share. If you want to help change the liturgical paraments and set-up for Holy Communion, please talk to Altar Guild member Barb Strenge.

The historic ecumenical practice of wearing chasubles before and during the consecrating, as well as celebrating Holy Communion, is a liturgical action shared by clergy among the Anglican (Church of England), Episcopalians (U.S.), Orthodox and Roman Catholic. There may be other religious and faith groups that wear something similar since many of these liturgical vestments were worn in geographical regions that were colder.



Wearing these also began historically when few worshippers were literate in Latin or the language of the missionaries - - -thus chausables were a sign that the sacrament of Holy Communion will be shared. The liturgical colors emphasize the liturgical church year season the way that stained-glass windows teach the biblical stories without words.





October 2024 - Council invited congregation members to receive nomination as a slate for the Galilee Call Committee members. Congregation nominees provided a statement of interest for election to the Call Committee.

November 2024 - All Committee slate elected.

Call Committee first Wednesday meeting was on Wednesday, Dec.4, 2024.

The Galilee Call Committee has spent much time discerning and choosing, with clarity and specificity, responses based on your Dec. 15 & 29 input and actual ministry practices. After completing all the questions in the Ministry Site Profile, this document will be submitted to the St. Paul Area Synod (SPAS). After their review, the Call Committee will present the content of the MSP.

Because we are in the Lenten season, Call Committee will meet on Mondays (Bible Study on the Gospel of Luke is paused- - to be resumed April 28th). As interim pastor, I have been shepherding the completion of the Galilee Lutheran Ministry Site Profile assisting with discernment and decisions in the responses to the interpretative questions. The Galilee Call Committee will elect a chairperson/s before submitting the profile to the SPAS.
